Our place

CWHHS is a statutory body providing care to 10,546 permanent residents, of which 7.3 per cent identify as being of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander origin. Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population reside across the breadth of our fifteen communities with highest representation being in the communities of Boulia, Barcoo, Tambo and Winton.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Advisory Council

The CWHHS Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Advisory Council (the Council) will provide advice to the CWHHS Board to inform strategic planning to support the delivery of meaningful and responsive locally appropriate healthcare for our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The Council will meet every two (2) months.

Membership

The Council will consist of members who collectively bring:

- A demonstrated cultural competence and understanding of the health needs of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people
- An understanding of the current and emerging issues in relation to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander social determinants of health
- Proven engagement in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community/ies they represent
- Representation of a Traditional Owner and recognised custodian groups or can be endorsed by same

Individuals who can demonstrate they currently undertake an active role in their Community as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander mentors are encouraged to apply.

Current employees of Central West Hospital and Health Service are not eligible to apply.

Key accountabilities

As a member of the Council you will be expected to:

- attend each of the Council meetings
- actively engage with Community

Remuneration

Members of the Council will be remunerated in line with the *Remuneration procedures for part-time chairs and members of Queensland government bodies* – Regulation, administration and advice – level 3. **McAULIFFE STREET
ENTRY OPEN**
