Report from OIC Aramac Police

On Thursday 14th March 2019 the overall response capability of the Aramac Emergency Services was put to the test during a joint real-life exercise. The real-life scenario-based exercise was coordinated by Aramac Queensland Police Service (QPS) in partnership with; Aramac Auxiliary Fire Brigade (QFRS), Aramac Queensland Ambulance Service (QAS), Aramac State Emergency Service (SES), Barcaldine Regional Council Aramac District Manager (DM) and Queensland Health Aramac Primary Health Centre (PHC). The scenario was designed to test the overall response capabilities of all

emergency services from initial call out to flying a patient out at the Aramac Airport. The scenario consisted of a house fire with potential explosive

substances scattered throughout the yard and near the fire front.

The fire scene kept our QFRS and QPS very busy. Our QFRS had to manage not only the fire but a variety of assets and potential explosive substances that were scattered throughout the yard, as such the QPS declared an emergent situation. To add a bit of pressure to the QFRS the scenario included one fire officer collapsing with heat stroke whilst on the fire front. Our QAS were kept busy providing quality first response medical treatment to a burns patient. Due to the patient's injuries the PHC was activated and our PHC nurse stepped in and took over continuing with the provision of quality medical care whilst our QAS returned to the fire scene to treat another patient. While all this was happening, our DM launched into action to ready the evacuation centre at the Aramac Hall. As an emergent situation had ben declared due to potential explosions, our SES were evacuating up to 30 people from the houses that adjoined the block where the fire was. Once our DM had the evacuation centre ready the airport needed to be prepared so the Royal Flying Doctors Service plane could land safely at night. Once the patient was loaded onto the plane and the fire was out the exercise was declared complete.

I would like to thank all our emergency service personnel including our DM for their participation in the exercise. The level of enthusiasm and skill demonstrated by our emergency service personnel and our DM is testament to their dedication



to their roles and in serving our community. A special thankyou goes out to Barcaldine Regional Council who delivered materials to and prepared the site. Also, our School Nurse Donna Hovey who assessed the skill level of our QAS officers.

Whilst all our emergency service personnel, including our DM demonstrated that they possess the skills and knowledge to effectively manage this type of major incident future similar exercises will be planned. This will ensure our emergency service first response and incident management skills remain at a high level and meet community expectations. Next time you see one of our emergency service personnel or our DM around town please thank them for their efforts in ensuring that a high level of emergency response service is provided to our community.
