On a wider topic I attended the State Government Cabinet Christmas Party where the Premier committed to more subsidies for cluster fences to keep out the dogs and another round of Work for Queensland funding. That's good news for us!

Releasing balloons is littering

In Queensland, the release of balloons into the environment is considered littering

under the Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011-whether released deliberately or by accident.

While a person may have the permission of the occupier of a place to release a balloon, once the balloon leaves that place it becomes litter.



The law does not differentiate between different types of littered material and whether the waste is biodegradable or not. The release of single or multiple balloons can constitute either littering or an illegal dumping depending on the volume of material released.

Penalties apply.
