October 2018 marks the 100 year anniversary of the devastating 1918 Saltern Creek Bushfires, a tragedy in which seven people lost their lives.

This remains one of the worst fire disasters in Queensland's history. Barcaldine Regional Council will mark the occasion with the unveiling of the memorial at Bryan Park, Oak Street, on Monday 29 October 2018 at 9.30am, followed by a morning tea and viewing of the commemorative display in the History Room of the Globe.

Aramac Aquatic Centre opens

The Aramac Aquatic Centre opened on Friday 28 September ready for the summer swimming season.

Locals and visitors now have a state of the art facility to cool down during the hot summer months.

The aquatic centre replaced Aramac's 65 year old pool with a new 25m six-lane swimming pool and includes a children's splash pad and water treatment plant and building and refurbished amenities block.

The \$2million project was funded by the Queensland Government's Building our Regions program and the Barcaldine Regional Council.

\$30,000 for regional arts projects

Barcaldine Regional Council has recieved \$25,000 funding from Arts Queensland for its 2018-2019 Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF). With Council's contribution of \$5,000 the Progam's total budget is \$30,000.

Queensland Arts Minister Leeanne Enoch said investing in creative and cultural experiences through the RADF strengthened regional communities, boosted cultural tourism, and enhanced the quality of life in rural and remote towns and cities.

"RADF is a unique partnership between the Queensland Government and Barcaldine Regional Council to support local talent, unite communities and celebrate the arts across the state.

"The Queensland Government, through Arts Queensland, is contributing \$2.08 million in 2018-19 in partnership with 58 councils statewide to help deliver cultural experiences which align with local priorities," Ms Enoch said.

Council is now looking for new applications and activities such as craft, painting, threatre, singing, cultural development and more.

National Disability Insurance Scheme

The NDIS (National Disability Insurance Scheme) rolled out in our region in November 2017. It is the new system that provides ongoing, individual support to those who have a disability



Our region is managed by the Rockhampton NDIA (National Disability Insurance Agency) which covers the whole Central West region. Participants have an individual plan developed to best meet their needs around:

- 1. Core Supports - daily tasks,
- 2. Capital Supports - assistive technology and modifications, and
- 3. Capacity Supports - community participation.

These supports are then managed over the life of your plan (usually a year) and then re-assessed according to your needs.

Barcaldine Regional Council Community Care Services is a registered provider of the NDIS. We are now providing direct care services, under all the support areas within our local communities. We are also the only Plan Management agency in the Central West.
